2. Finance

BID debtors / BCC

Michelle Baker updated the Board on the BID levy that remains uncollected 2011-2023. Birmingham City Council have said they will provide an update on this soon as they had reduced the amount. Mark Wilkinson said he will email Birmingham City Council for an update.

3. Review of BID events

Michelle Baker discussed the BID events that had taken place:

- Carl Chinn Talk on The Real Peaky Blinders took place on Thursday 13th June.
 Five BID Board members had attended the event, along with 200 attendees
 and all agreed it was a brilliant evening that the BID would like to repeat,
 perhaps a talk by Carl Chinn on the history of Sutton Coldfield. A comedy
 night was also discussed.
- Dino Day Sat 15th June. This event was very well attended and the Gracechurch Centre had hosted the event on their new lawn area due to the wet weather forecast. The BID organised three dinosaurs, a Jurassic Park 4X4 vehicle, free children's crafts, free children's face painting, a bubble-ologist and a balloon modeller.
- Farmers & Craft Market the BID has booked a new fruit & veg stall for June and July market dates. The fee has been waivered for the trader as an incentive as it will also benefit the market and fellow traders to have a fruit & veg stall.

4. BID Projects Update

The neglected brick planters on the corner of Duke Street / Birmingham Road have now been filled with compost and planted with lavender, organised and funded by the BID. (See before/after photos overleaf). Howden Insurance and the Brewhouse & Kitchen have both agreed to water and maintain the lavender and the BID has arranged for plaques to state 'Sponsored By' with the BID / Howden / Brewhouse logos.

The BID Food & Drink Guide has been updated for 2024 and some suggestions were made. Mark Wilkinson said a competition idea could be to collect receipts from venues listed on the guide or to receive a stamp at the venues for each visit. The Food & Drink Guide will be relaunched at the Food Festival in September.

The Royal Cinema opens in July and Michelle Baker has met with the cinema manager Des Christie for a tour of the venue during the renovation work. The

cinema will open in July. Michelle Baker has produced a car park guide as there had been many enquiries on where customers could park now the cinema car park is no longer available.

The cinema interviewed candidates today and the BID had arranged for interviews to be hosted at Heavenly Desserts on Birmingham Road.

The two litter bins near the College look unsightly and need replacing and there is also a need for a new litter bin to be installed by the brick planters on the corner of Duke Street / Birmingham Road as Chris Prescod (manager at the Brewhouse & Kitchen) is watering the lavender and removing litter and cigarettes from the planters as the planters are being used in the absence of a litter bin. Cllr David Barrie has contacted Birmingham City Council to ask how the BID can progress this and he will follow this up.

5. <u>Upcoming and Confirmed BID Events</u>

The Board discussed BID events:

- Monthly Farmers & Craft Market last Sunday of the month March-Nov

6. Any other business

The Board asked Michelle Baker to contact the Town Council to ask for an update on the new Town Board representation. Previous correspondence was on 9th May and on 20th May the Council replied to confirm membership was under discussion.

Chris Prescod, manager of the Brewhouse & Kitchen said that he had been in his new role for three months and the Police had not visited the venue once, other than with licencing during the start of the Euros and he was disappointed with the lack of a visible Police presence, especially in the evening. Michelle Baker to follow up with the Police.


